Introduction

1. NUST Institute of Civil Engineering (NICE), School of Civil & Environmental Engineering (SCEE), National University of Sciences & Technology (NUST) is a premier Institution of the country offering high quality education in Civil Engineering. The programme of Civil Engineering offered at SCEE (NICE) ranks number one in Pakistan and among 151-200 in the world, as per QS Ranking 2026. SCEE (NICE) offers Bachelor of Civil Engineering Degree besides MS and PhD Programmes and remains in the forefront as a constituent Institute of NUST in promoting sound engineering education characterized by quality, extensive research, and global exposure. Graduates of NUST are developed to deliver in the technology-and business-intensive environment of today and meet the challenges of the highly competitive world of tomorrow.
2. Careful reading and understanding of the information contained in this document will help the student's smooth transition to this new phase of their academic life. An overview of various aspects of training and administration is provided to help you settle down during the first few weeks. Registration

4. All students will be registered with NUST, and the allotted registration number will be activated within the first two weeks of Fall Semester on Qalam / Learning Management System.

Conferment

5. The undergraduate Civil Engineering (CE) program is based on academic and research requirements as prescribed by NUST Statutes and Policies and Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC) guidelines. Upon successful completion, students will be awarded BE (Civil Engineering) Degree by NUST, duly accredited by Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC).

Schedule (Academic Year 2026-27)

6. The undergraduate program of Civil Engineering will commence at NUST Institute of Civil Engineering (NICE), NUST Campus, H-12 Sector Islamabad with effect from 02nd September 2026. Classes will be held for five days a week, from 07th September 2026. The first semester, i.e., Fall Semester 2026 will be of 18 weeks duration from 07th September 2026 to 10th January 2027. Breakdown of the course is as under: -

Orientation Plan

7. NUST is arranging an Orientation Week for the Freshmen from 02nd to 04th September 2026. NUST Orientation Committee has planned various activities for the freshmen to enhance their awareness about NUST facilities and the scope for social entrepreneurship (*Detailed Program is attached*). - (5) **Reproduction**: Photocopying and printing facilities are available on payment. Photocopying and reproduction of copyrighted / classified documents is strictly forbidden.
- (6) **Computer Centre**: A well-equipped computer center is available to the students. Latest, state-of-the-art computer software is available for academic and research work to the students. Internet facilities are available throughout the campus in the form of LAN and WAN.
- (7) **Training Aids**: Multi-media, view graphs, slide projector, digital cameras, etc.; are available for use as and when required.
- (8) **Stationery**: Students can purchase stationery from campus stationery shop.

Joining Procedure

9. Students residing in NUST Hostels will report on **01st Sep 2026 (Tuesday)** while Day scholars / students residing outside NUST campus will report on **02nd Sep 2026 (Wednesday)** at **0900 hours** at SCEE (NICE). Admission letter will be considered as an admit card for entry in to NUST. The detailed Orientation program is attached as per **Annex A**.

10. Students should bring along the following documents: -

- a. **Original CNIC / Form “B” along with 4 attested photocopies**
- b. **2x photocopies of CNIC (Father / Guardian)**
- c. **6 (Six) passport size and 4 (Four) “1x1” photographs**
- d. **Original SSC, HSSC duly attested by **Inter Board Coordination Commission (IBCC)** (or equivalent) / O/A Level equivalence along with statement of results and 4x photocopies of each certificate duly attested by a gazetted officer. *Keep photocopies and scanned copies for your personal record for subsequent use, as your original documents will be retained by the Institute.***
- e. **O/A level examinations equivalent certificates from IBCC (along with a statement of result).**

- f. **Original NUST selection letter / Admission Fee Challan.**
- g. **2x photocopies of Domicile Certificate**

General Information

11. Accommodation.

- a. Students interested in hostel accommodation should download the hostel-accommodation Form from the NUST website on following link:

- b. NUST students requesting hostel accommodation will be provided with furnished rooms. However, the students shall bring their own bedding, i.e., bed cover, pillow with cover, blanket, etc.
- c. The students who have been already allotted hostel accommodation may arrive on **dates already provided by hostel authorities** and proceed to their designated hostels.

12. **Dress Code / Outfit / Clothing.** To maintain academic dignity and sanctity of the educational institution, students are supposed to wear decent and sober dress. The purpose of the dress code is to provide basic guidelines for appropriate dress code to be followed in NUST campus rather than imposing strict restrictions / enforcement of dress code. It is also assumed freshmen of NUST would value the norms / culture of university / and will dress up in a dignified manner. Guidelines on dress code for students are as under: -

a. Male Students

(1) Summer

- (a) Dress trousers with a shirt. Tie optional.
- (b) Shalwar Kameez with a waist coat.
- (c) Closed Shoes / Closed Chappals with straps (Slippers not allowed).
- (d) Safari Suit.

(2) **Winter**

- (a) Dress trouser – Shirt with coat or Sweater / Jacket.
- (b) Closed or open Collar – Lounge suit / combination.
- (c) Shalwar Kameez with waist coat / coat
- (d) Closed Shoes / Closed Chappals with straps (Slippers not allowed).

b. **Female Students.** Sober and decent clothing (both summer & winter).

c. **Guidelines for Students.** Students in compliance with the dress code shall avoid wearing the following during classes: -

- (1) Shorts and sleeveless shirts.
 - (2) T-Shirts / dress bearing language or art, which appears to be provocative or indecent and is likely to offend others.
 - (3) Shabby or torn clothing.
 - (4) Jogging or exercise clothing during classes.
 - (5) Untidy, gaudy, or immodest dress in classrooms, cafeteria and university offices.
 - (6) Unprofessional attire in formal programmes and interviews (i.e., jeans, multicolored clothes, casual shoes etc.).
 - (7) Putting on excessive makeup or wearing expensive jewelry (Female students).
- Wearing any type of Turban is not allowed in NUST premises.*

13. **NUST Identity Card.** All students will be issued temporary identity cards on arrival. However, permanent NUST identity cards will be issued later. Students will be responsible for the safe custody of their identity cards.

14. **Accuracy of University Records.** Students are expected to furnish accurate and complete information on all university forms and documents, including applications for admission and financial aid, references, local and home addresses and for other types of records. Provision of any inaccurate / concealment of information may lead to termination from the institute.

15. **Leave.** Students are required to get the leave sanctioned in advance on a prescribed leave application form. The Leave application form is to be submitted only for genuine emergencies. However, 75% attendance is mandatory for the students to take a semester exam in each subject. Students are required to be present in the classroom as per the training program.

16. **Discipline.** Political activities are strictly forbidden on NUST premises, and all students are required to give a written undertaking at the time of joining that they will refrain from politics during their stay at NUST. The following practices are considered unacceptable for the students:

- a. Theft or damage to the property of the Institute or of property of a member of Institute community or the property of a visitor to school or abetment to any of the above.
- b. The conduct of those results in conviction of a crime or crimes in a court of competent jurisdiction may subject a student to disciplinary action including suspension or expulsion.
- c. Possession of firearms, explosives, dangerous chemicals or other weapons on SCEE (NICE) campus, or the display or use of the above to intimidate, frighten or control individuals.
- d. Engaging in conduct which obstructs or disrupts teaching, research, administration, disciplinary procedures, or other activities of the institute.
- e. Keeping pets/animals, cassette players etc., or possessing any morally/religiously objectionable printed material.
- f. Using drugs and smoking on the Campus.

17. **Academic Honesty**

- a. SCEE (NICE) requires all students to adhere to high standards of integrity in their academic work. The school follows a zero-tolerance policy for activities such as plagiarism and cheating. Students found involved in such activities are subject to serious disciplinary action.
- b. Plagiarism is defined as the use, whether by paraphrase or direct quotation, of the published or unpublished work of another without full and clear acknowledgment. Cheating includes giving or receiving unauthorized assistance on quizzes, examinations or written assignments from any source not approved by the instructor. Examples of cheating include but are not limited to: -
 - (1) Submitting someone else's work as one's own with or without the permission of the individual concerned.
 - (2) Allowing someone to copy one's work.
 - (3) Using a writing service or having someone else write a paper for oneself.
 - (4) Using someone else's work without proper citation.
 - (5) Submitting collaborative and/or group work as one's own.
 - (6) Stealing a test or question paper from a teacher's office.
- c. Taking a course and/or examination for another student.
- d. Using unauthorized materials during a test or exam.
- e. Possession of a cell phone or any other electronic gadget that can help during exams.

18. **Rules/Regulations.** The Institute follows the semester system of teaching. Grades are awarded on a variable grading system. Students will be briefed about academic regulations on joining.

19. **Scholarships & Financial Assistance.** Awarded as below: -

- a. Various organizations also offer Scholarship/Financial Assistance.

- b. **NUST Need Based Scholarship.** Scheme available to enable financially underprivileged but talented students to acquire higher education on NUST campuses. Salient features of the scheme are:
 - (1) Scholarships are based on assessment of need and merit as well as availability of funds.
 - (2) Scholarship awarded for the full duration of the programme on which the student is enrolled. Minimum CGPA of 2.5 is mandatory.
 - c. **Fund for Needy SCEE Students.** SCEE has established a fund titled as “Fund for Needy SCEE Students” to help the students who are unable to bear the expenditure of their studies and have not been able to earn the financial support from other sources. In this connection two sources of donations are identified: -
 - (1) Regular monthly donations by the SCEE Faculty and Staff Officers.
 - (2) Contribution out of the share of SCEE from earnings of projects executed by SCEE Institutes.
20. **Transport Facility for Day Scholars.** Pick and drop facility on selected routes will be provided on payment after student’s request within one week of commencement of semester.
21. **Mess.** All students utilizing the hostel facilities will dine in respective hostel mess and would be required to clear mess bills monthly. They will become members of the mess on the day of reporting.
22. **Opening of a Bank Account.** All students intending to open a bank account in Habib Bank Limited at H-12 Sector, Islamabad should bring 4 attested copies of CNIC along with the original. Students who are not in possession of ID cards may use a supplementary ATM of their parents’ bank accounts.

23. **Personal Transport.** Students joining the hostel are allowed to bring bicycles only at the time of joining. Other transport Cars / Motorcycles will require prior permission of Hostel Management.

25. **Access to Email, Qalam and Campus Wi-Fi:** Once given to students, Qalam ID shall be used as an email account, access to Qalam and Campus Wi-Fi.

NUST Email Policy

- a. The NUST Email Policy is intended for NUST domain-based email only.
- b. You are responsible for maintaining the security of username and password.

- c. It will be users' responsibility to take backups of emails on your computer on a regular basis.
- d. Use strong passwords including alphanumeric and special characters.
- e. Passwords should be changed on a regular basis.
- f. In case a password is lost, a user is required to approach IT Support Services. (itsupport@nice.nust.edu.pk)

Email Retention

- a. NUST emails shall be retained on the server if the user account is officially active.
- b. For graduated students, six (06) months duration shall be provided prior to deactivation of email account.

Email Storage Quotas

- a. The minimum email quota shall be 50GB for all email users.
- b. In addition to email storage, 1TB of Microsoft OneDrive cloud storage should also be available to all registered email users.
- c. Information sent on to an insecure email address through auto forwarding of email from a NUST email to a non NUST email address, i.e., a personal email address, is not allowed.
- d. All official correspondence will be given NUST Email ID.
- e. You are responsible for your Emails and data on OneDrive.

29. **Important Notice for Parents and Students**

- a. Under the provision of Para 33 (a) Chapter V of NUST Statues/ Regulations, a student shall **Not be allowed** to appear in the final examination of a subject in which his attendance is less than 75%, and he shall be awarded “XF” grade in that subject. The “XF” grade so obtained shall only be cleared by repetition of the course whenever offered.
- b. An online system, Qalam (*a portal for interaction between faculty and students during the whole academic cycle*) is being used for maintaining students’ attendance, grading, financials etc. Students will be given a username and password by the UG Academic Section of SCEE (NICE) for accessing Qalam portal. Parents can use their ward's Qalam credentials for checking the attendance status online any time during the semester. Parents may login with their ward's Qalam credentials to monitor online attendance status throughout the semester.
- c. At the time of joining, you must ensure that your academic documents are complete, valid, and meet the prescribed eligibility criteria. You are required to have **at least 60% marks in both SSC and HSSC**, as applicable. Candidates with **O/A Levels** must submit the relevant **equivalence certificates** with the required subjects to establish their eligibility. **Please note that 60% marks in SSC and HSSC are mandatory eligibility requirements.** Candidates securing less than 60% marks in either SSC or HSSC will be considered ineligible, and their admission will be withdrawn.
- d. Academic marks entered in the online application form should be the same as per original documents. If any discrepancy is found in the entered marks on the online application form during the admission process, the student will be withdrawn from the university at any stage.

- e. Any SSC or HSSC candidate appearing in exams after the commencement of classes on **7th September 2026** shall be deemed ineligible and withdrawn from the program at any stage.
- f. Candidates appearing in the 2nd Annual Examination of the Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education, or the October/November O/A-Level (or equivalent) examinations, are not eligible for admission in the current session.
- g. Along with Qalam there is another online system, Learning Management System (LMS) which is used for sharing course content with students. Students will be provided with LMS credentials (Same as Qalam credentials provided by Acad section) for accessing LMS portal and they will be required to enroll in all the courses on LMS under the assigned section.
